Principal Point of the Lesson

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"The foundational principle for your purpose is this: God created you for Himself. This is why knowing God intimately is foundational for the fulfillment of your purpose: You were created for God. You were not created for yourself."



Key Scripture for this Lesson

Jeremiah 29: 11-14 11 For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. 12 Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. 13 You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. 14 I will be found by you," declares the Lord, "and will bring you back from captivity....



Points from the Video

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With God as our foundation, we become empowered for His purposes and find our place as members of the body of Christ.

God empowers us for his purposes (Colossians 1:16-17) and can use us for His glory in whatever stage of life we find ourselves.

God, as Trinity, exists in community. Since we are made in His image, we need community, which we find in the body of Christ.

Jesus Christ is the basis for unity with one another (Ephesians 2:15-22).

We are all members of one body 1st Corinthians 12:12 - 26).
