Session Goals

- Main Idea: God empowers ordinary people, like us, with his Spirit to share the good news of Christ with others.

- Life Change: To share at least one aspect of our faith with someone new.

Points from the Video

- Worried that you don't know enough?
- Christianity is NOT a spectator sport! (mat 28:19-20)
- Connection to Jesus! (acts 4:13)
- Fishing for People. (mat 4:18-19)



Discussion Question(s)

- Have you ever felt like you were too ordinary to make an impact on how others see Christ? What qualifications did you think you needed to tell others about Jesus?
- When you think of Jesus's disciples, what characteristics do you typically assume they had? In what ways do you think they were different from you?
- How have you allowed your lack of training or experience to stop you from expressing your faith? What would it look like for you to talk about Jesus more boldly?



Discussion Question(s) (cont.)

- When you heard Shelly's story, how did her example impact you? If you let yourself dream BIG, what could God do through you if you shared the gospel more freely?

- What is your Jesus story?

- Whom could you tell your story (testimony) to?



My Final Thoughts

Malachi 2:6-7 - describes the perfect servants of God

- Truth on their lips, obedience in their walk, fellowship with God, a burden to bring others to the Lord, and a passion to share God's Word with those who need to hear it.



Things which encourage your development as a Disciple



Prayer - Specifically praying for the ministry that you are in or asking the Lord to give you a ministry where you are discipling another.

Scripture - Memorizing Scripture so that you can both reflect upon it and have it available as a tool in any situation.

Personal testimony - Having a prepared, organized personal testimony that can be given in any situation.
